4 MERMEN OF NORTHWESTERN DAZZLE STUDES WITH SPEED. COACH TOM ROBINSON LIKES GYM POOL SO WELL HE IS COMING TO BOULDER THIS SUMMER; OLYMPIC CHAMPS AMAZE FANS WITH SPEED IN THE WATER

The four mermen of Northwestern officially dedicated the swimming pool at the university gymnasium Tuesday afternoon by defeating the Silver and Gold tankmen, 41-18.

The Purple won every first place in nine events. Colorado piled up its points in seconds and thirds. Five hundred fans saw the meet.

Northwestern gave a splendid exhibition of swimming. Capt. Ralph Breyer, Dick Howell, Paul Corbett and Paul Manovitz hold innumerable world and collegiate records, and many swimming records.

Northwestern has won the Big Ten swimming championship eight times in the last eleven years. Tom Robinson, who exhibited here yesterday also, has been coach at Northwestern for sixteen years. He likes Boulder so well he plans to spend part of his vacation here next summer, and will give swimming exhibitions at the university gymnasium two or three days then. He said the university pool was one of the finest in which his men had ever exhibited.

The Northwestern swimmers will exhibit at the University of Utah tomorrow and at the Hollywood Athletic club Feb. 7; Stanford university Feb. 10, and Oregon Aggies Feb. 12.

For Colorado, Capt. Nash, Hoagland, Anderson, Tribble, Philleo and Frost were point winners.
